The Olympics are open to registered GOYANS from all 55 parishes of the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of New Jersey which includes New Jersey, Philadelphia area, Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Kessler Stadium/Opening Ceremony

Communities should arrive at Kessler Stadium with church banners and proceed to line-up for parade. All GOYANS should be dressed in their community's corresponding colors and uniform. No ripped shirts, shorts, cutoffs, baseball hats, bandannas, etc., are allowed. There will be a mandatory, coaches meeting prior to the start of the track events/kick-off. Please listen to announcements for exact time and place. All scratches should be given to Andy Hios.

Open Ceremony Program

GOYANS must stay at Kessler Field until all events for the day have been completed. GOYANS must be always escorted by an Advisor or a chaperone including traveling to/from dining and residence halls. Communities must ensure their stadium seating areas are cleaned and no garbage is left behind.

Ann Haviaris Memorial Volleyball Tournament

Volleyball will start at 3:00pm on the two Boylan Gym basketball courts and one on the OFBC court.

Swimming

Swimming events will begin in the Boylan Gym after track events conclude at approximately 3:00pm. NOTE: GOYANS cannot participate in both swimming and volleyball, they must choose 1 event.

JOY 100M Run

On Sunday morning before the running events begin we will have the JOY 100M Run and each parish is welcome to have kids of the ages 8 to 12 participate in the run. After the run each kid will receive a medal from His Eminence and the Clergy. By April 28th we will need each Parish to provide us the number of kids that will be doing it from their Parish.

Outdoor Gathering

An outdoor gathering will take place from 9:00-11:00pm for all registered Olympic participants. Before leaving the gathering at 11pm all advisors must checkout with Archdeacon Konstantinos.

Attire will be casual. Jeans, shorts, and sneakers are allowed. Metropolis dress code rules below apply. 1. The wearing of clothing bearing obscene words or suggesting indecent and unacceptable behavior will not be permitted.

2. The length of all shorts, skirts, skorts, etc., will apply to the "fingertip rule". The length of the garment must be to be at or lower than the level of the person's finger tips when arms are parallel to the body.

3. Garments will always cover midriffs and underwear.

- 4. Halter or low-cut or strapless tops are not permitted.
- 5. Pants or other garments with holes or tears are not permitted.
- 6. Longer tops must be worn over leggings (leggings are not pants)

7. Parental approval of clothing which contradicts these guidelines, will not over-ride this policy or the Advisor's decision of inappropriate dress.

Divine Liturgy – Pollak Theater

Divine Liturgy will begin promptly at 8:30 a.m. Attendance at Liturgy is mandatory and will be taken for all communities. Sweatsuits may be worn, no shorts. Breakfast at Samuel Hays Magill will follow the Divine Liturgy. Communities will be dismissed for breakfast in the order they arrived for Liturgy.

Dorm Check-out

Advisors should check all rooms for damages, and anything left behind. Checkout by 11:30am.

Chris Gacos Memorial 5K Run at Kessler Stadium

The 5K run will start at approximately 3:00 p.m. or as soon as the last track event has concluded. At least (3) spotters from each community will be needed (one may be a coach). Run will be against the person and not the clock. Participating churches will be limited to 6 athletes, boys, or girls. Pull off tag numbers and pins will be given to each parish. GOYAN number and gender should be placed on pull off tag. Number must be pinned on the FRONT of the shirt. DO NOT pin the pull off tag to the shirt, this will be pulled at the end of the race when the runners are in the chute. When runners finish the race, they will be directed into a chute where pull off tags will be collected. They must stay in order when in the chute.

Fr. Dean Martin Memorial Award Ceremony @ Kessler Stadium

GOYANS should sit with their teams. Both individual and team medals will be awarded. Extinguishing of the Olympic flame by the Metropolis Youth Director will signify the conclusion of the ceremony.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND RULES

Housing/Residence Halls

Pick-up dorm keys/wrist bands at check-in tables in parking lots 1 and 3. Wrist bands must be always worn and needed for admittance to dining halls. Lost wrist bands will NOT be replaced. Luggage drop-off at assigned residence hall. All luggage should be tagged with GOYANS name, church, and city. GOYANS are responsible for bringing their own bed sheets, blankets, pillow, bath towels, and personal hygiene items.

Advisors should inspect all rooms for any damages before GOYANS move in. Any damages found by the MU staff and initially not reported to the General Conduct/Grievance Committee will be the responsibility of the church assigned to that room. GOYANS will be responsible for damages occurring in their respective room or for any other damage caused by them. Each community must always have an Advisor on the floor when youth are present. Advisors must have the contact information for their GOYA parents.

Any GOYAN found to be throwing articles out of the windows or "ledge hopping" from room to room, will be sent home immediately. GOYANS found tampering, damaging, or destroying fire emergency equipment will be sent home. Advisors, chaperones, and GOYANS must become familiar with fire evacuation procedures.

GOYANS are limited to Olympic event areas and their assigned residence hall. All other areas are strictly off limits! Any youth found off campus or in areas that are not occupied by the New Jersey Metropolis event will be subject to disciplinary action as determined by the General Conduct and Grievance Committee.

No jewelry or other valuables should be taken to Olympics. The Metropolis of New Jersey is not responsible for any valuables taken or lost. Advisors should check all rooms for damages, and anything left behind. Checkout by 11:30am.

Drinking/Smoking/Vaping/Energy Drinks

No smoking, drinking or substance abuse is permitted at any time throughout the weekend. In addition, vaping, electronic cigarettes energy drinks/energy shots are not permitted.

Any infraction will result in the immediate disqualification of the GOYAn(s) from the Olympics. In addition, the parish of the GOYAn(s) who commit any infractions will be subject to disqualification from the Olympics.

Off-Campus Housing

Parents assume responsibility for GOYANS who have opted out of on-campus housing. This includes all transportation and promptly adhering to event meeting times and schedules.

Cafeteria/Dining Hall

A wristband must be shown to enter the dining hall. GOYANS, Advisors/Chaperones must clean their tables and place the silverware and dinnerware at the appropriate places. Any church that does not properly clean their tables will be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to disqualification from the remaining events.

Insurance

All Church youth groups participating in the Olympics must have current athletic insurance coverage for all individual athletic injuries for participating in indoor and outdoor events. A copy of the policy must be submitted to the Olympic Committee at registration time.

Advisors

Each church must have a minimum of one Adult for every seven GOYANS. One of the Advisors in each participating community must be a rostered Advisor.

General Conduct /Grievance Committee

General Conduct/Grievance Committees are responsible for reviewing and deliberating all non-athletic issues. These include all aspects of discipline, both "on and off" the field. The Committee will work very closely with the Security Force at the Student Residences and with the Monmouth University Police in handling all related problems. Decisions of the Committee will be final.

Scheduling

All events, religious, athletic, and social, will begin promptly. When you are at the field, please do not wander beyond the range of the loudspeakers in case of time change announcements. Schedule is subject to change at the discretion of the Olympic Committee if deemed necessary. Schedule changes will be properly announced.

Uniforms

Each parish shall have uniforms (shorts and shirts/jerseys), complying with the assigned Olympic colors and bib number range. Sneakers, tennis shoes or track shoes without metal spikes are required. Each church must furnish each of its participants a number to be always worn on the field. Patches of 8 x 8 inches are required for the numbers.

Qualification of Athletes

Athletes must be registered GOYANS 12 years of age and in at least 7th grade to and including athletes who were 18 and still in high school as of September 1, 2023. GOYANS must enter at least one field/track or swimming event as an active participant.

Age Groupings Juniors: 7th, 8th and 9th grade Seniors: 10th, 11th, and 12th grade.

Junior Participation in a Senior Event

Juniors may participate only in senior relays. They may not run in both junior and senior relays of the same distance.

Substitutions

All entries and substitutions will be controlled by a new form sheet system. Every entry for every event must have a new form sheet printed and submitted to Andy Hios prior to the Olympic Games.

Awards/ Scoring

Medals will be given for first, second and third place winners, for all outdoor events. Ties - If two persons are involved in a tie, duplicate medals will be awarded, and the next place will be omitted.

An athlete can enter a MAXIMUM of FIVE Individual events & MAXIMUM of TWO relay events. The athlete must choose from the following combinations: Four (4) from Category A and One (1) from Category B OR Three (3) from Category A and Two (2) from Category B

Note: Athletes CANNOT choose five (5) individual Run/Swim Events (Category A) The athlete can be entered in only 2 of the 4 choices in the Relay Events (Category C)

Penalties

The Field Grievance Committee and the Executive Committee members will review all penalties before they are enacted. Any church not complying with the rules will be disqualified. Changes of the Rules & Regulations are at the discretion of the Field Grievance Committee.

Running Events

No starting blocks are allowed. Third false start disqualifies a runner or relay team. Runners must stay in lanes (see exceptions for the long distance runs and relays).

Pacing of the runners will NOT be allowed. If a violation occurs, the runner being paced will be disqualified. If this individual is part of a relay, the team will be disqualified. All contestants must report to the official starter or other assigned official at the scheduled time or forfeit the right to participate.

400m Run	Stagger Start	Stay in lane during full race.
800m Run	Line Start	May cross lane after first turn.
Mile Run	Line Start	May cross lane after first turn.
400m Relay (4X100M)	Stagger Start	Stay in lane during full race.
800m Relay (4X200M)	Stagger Start	May cross lane after second hand-off.
Mile Relay (4X400M)	Stagger Start	May cross lane after first hand-off.

Decision of the officials is FINAL.

Field Events: Long Jump and Shot-Put

Each athlete 3 jumps or throws.

In case of a tie, the second-best jump or throw will determine the placing.

Fouls count as 1 jump or throw.

In case of rain, the field events for that day will be eliminated.

Long Jump - All measuring is done from the front of the take-off line or board to the nearest point where any part of your body touches the ground.

<u>Shot-Put</u> - Competitors may not cross the restraining line or board. Distance will be measured from the line.

<u>Softball Throw</u> - Three throws will be allowed. The best of the three throws will be counted.

<u>Co-Ed Volleyball</u>

- The net will be at the girl's height -7 feet $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
- Teams will consist of 3 boys and 3 girls.
- Substitutions are allowed as long as 3 boys and 3 girls are always on the court.
- Boys are only allowed to spike from behind the 10-foot attack line.
- Boys cannot jump to block in front of the 10-foot attack line.
- All jewelry (of any kind) must be removed before the game is to begin.
- No liquids permitted on the court at any time during the game.
- Only coaches are permitted at the score table.
- Players will report to the scorekeeper only when entering the game as a substitute.
- All substitutes who are to enter the game must be lined-up and ready to enter the court.
- Rule for substitutions, a boy may substitute for a boy and a girl for a girl and the substitutions are unlimited.
- Male GOYAns cannot use one-hand forward motions when in the front row. Bumping and setting with two hands is required.
 - Note: Referees must look for attempts to push the ball and use one-hand forward motions.
- Male GOYAns are welcome to spike/attack/hit but may only do so from behind the ten foot line. Jumping is permitted as long as the jump begins behind the ten-foot line.
- All other high school volleyball regulations apply, as they do during the regular Fall seasons.

Tournament Format

- 1st and 2nd round games: one game, (21) points must win by 2 points, rally-point scoring, switch at 11 points, NO CAP.
- 3rd round games and 3rd place game: best 2 out of 3 games, (15) points with (19) point cap, rally scoring.

Championship match: best 2 out of 3 games to (15) points with (19) point cap, rally scoring.
